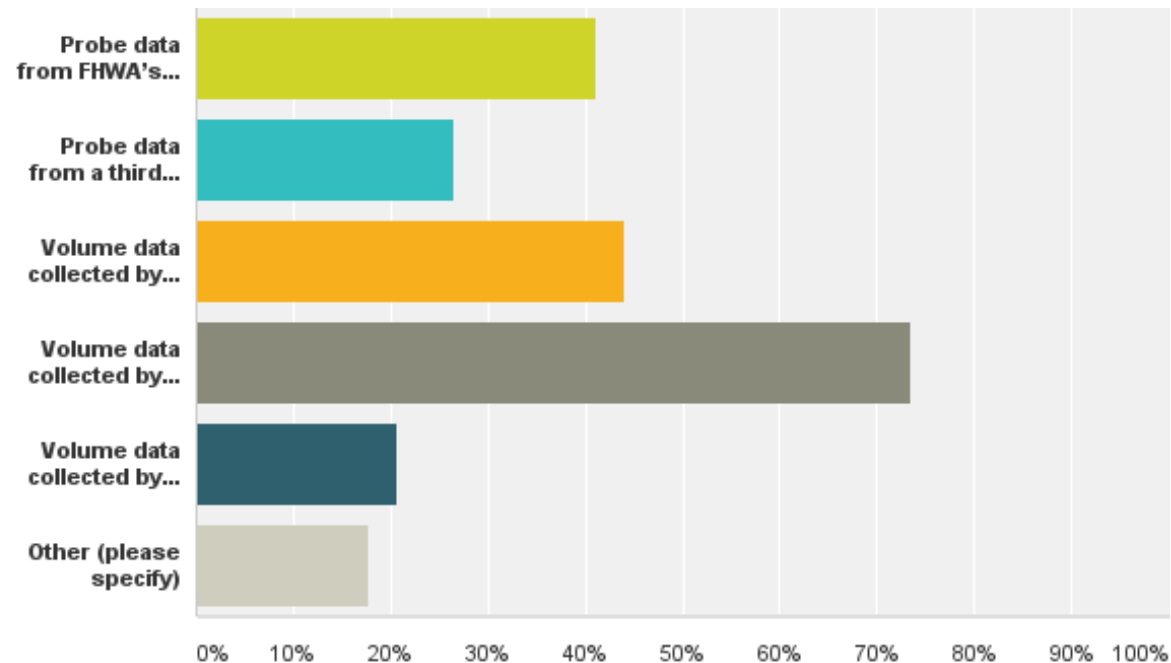


AMPO Performance Data Survey Highlights



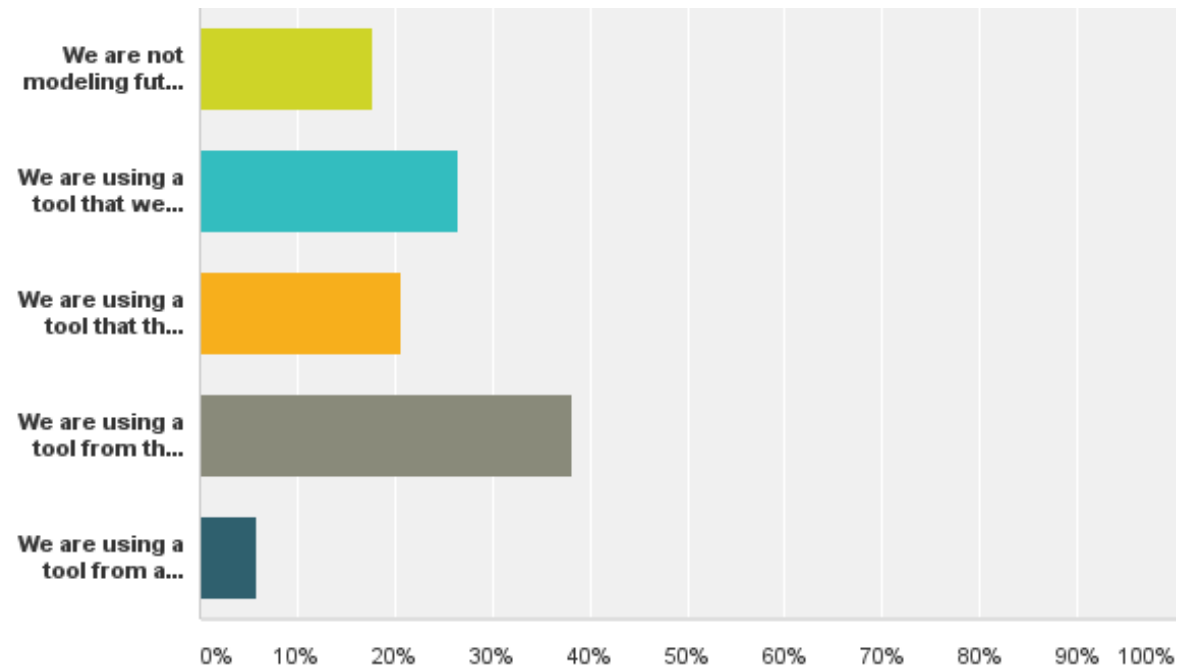
What data are you using for measuring mobility/congestion performance and how are you getting the data?

- *Of those that responded, 74% reported using volume data collected by the state DOT.*



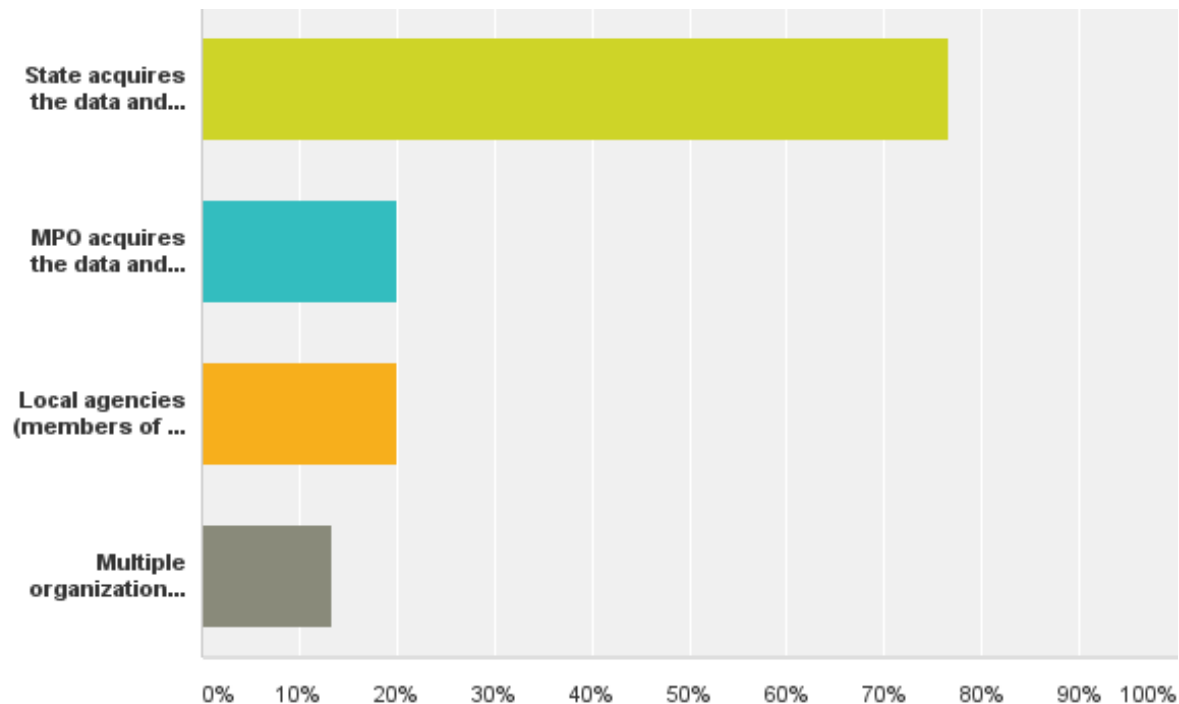
Are you using any tools to model mobility/congestion performance in the future? If yes, what tools?

- *Of those that responded, nearly 40% reported using a tool from the private sector.*



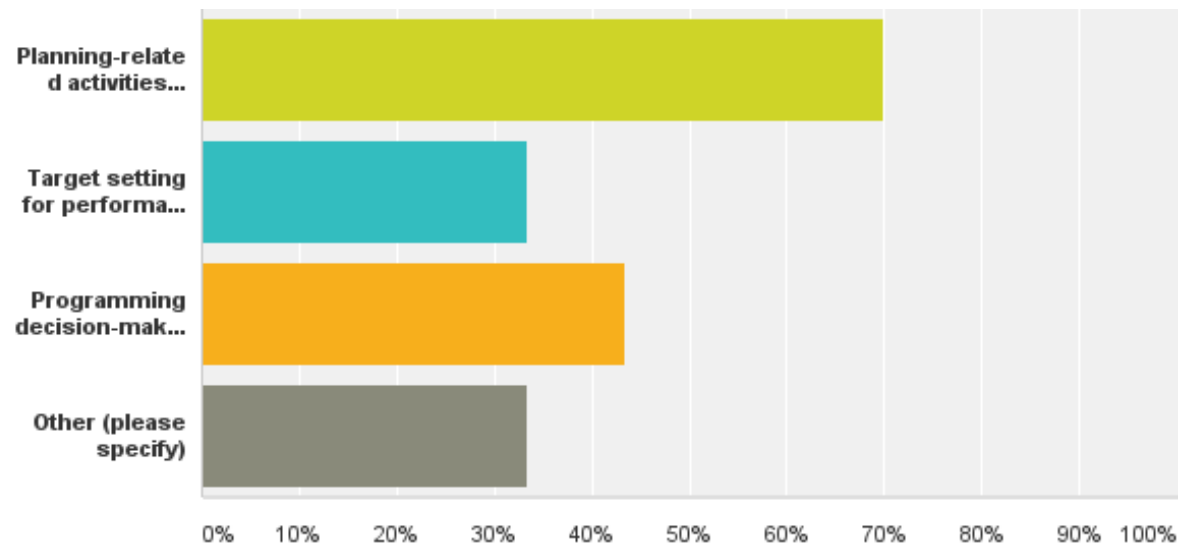
Is any of your data acquisition and analysis for mobility/congestion performance being done collaboratively with your state DOT?

- *Of those that responded, 77% reported that the State acquires the data and makes it available to MPOs.*



Are any decisions being made collaboratively with your state DOT regarding mobility/congestion performance (i.e., target setting)?

- *Of those that responded, 70% reported that planning-related activities (long range plan, corridor plans, congestion mitigation plans, etc.) are done collaboratively with the state.*



If you are an MPO that crosses state DOT boundaries, what coordination mechanisms do you have for working with multiple state DOTs for mobility/congestion performance measurement and data management?

- *“Support the State DOT’s Targets. Completed within 180 days of states adoption of goals (February 27, 2018). A mechanism jointly with the State DOTs shall be established to report these targets and annual values upon request of FHWA.”*
- *“We have established a regional committee that meets regularly for coordination on congestion management and ITS Architecture coordination in the region. This includes both states and local jurisdictions that operate transportation systems.*

– “Membership of both State DOTs on the Technical Advisory Committee and Council.”
